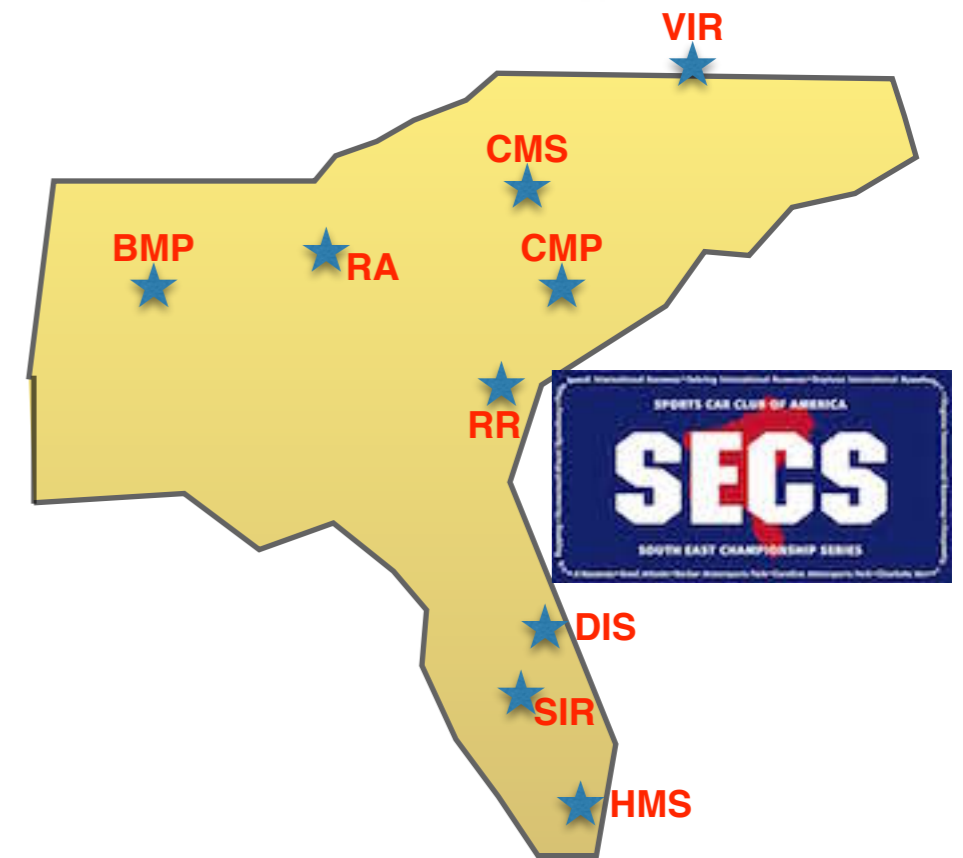

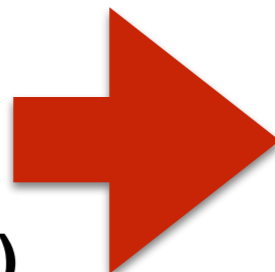

## 2015 Southeast Championship Series (SECS) Top 10 Facts

1. SECS events may have one or two SECS points races - make sure to read the schedule for those events that have two races in a weekend.
2. SECS races may be run concurrently with SARRC races - but you will only earn points in one series. A car running an SECS race is not eligible to receive SARRC points for the same race group.
3. SECS participation is restricted to Runoffs eligible classes.
4. SECS cars shall have SECS decals on each side of the vehicle. In addition, sedans and SRF will have a 3rd decal on the rear.
5. Points will be awarded using the Majors point scale (25 for 1st down to 1 for 20th). A car must complete at least half of the laps of the overall group winner in order to be eligible for points.
6. Novice permits with school requirements completed may be allowed in SECS races. However, to compete in the Runoffs, a driver must hold a current SCCA Full Competition License or SCCA Pro License.
7. Divisional Class Championships will be determined by the best 7 eligible finishes. Drivers are eligible for Runoffs Tow Fund via SECS.
8. A driver must finish 4 races in a class at a minimum of 2 SECS weekends to be eligible for a Divisional Class Championship for that class.
9. A driver may include the results of up to two Southeast Division Majors weekends held at Sebring, Homestead, Atlanta and VIR plus their SECS finishes.
10. To qualify for a Runoffs invitation via SECS, a driver must meet participation and performance requirements:
  - A. Participation Requirement: A competitor must participate on track in a minimum of four SECS points weekends. (Remember that up to two Majors weekends at Sebring, Homestead, Atlanta and VIR may be counted as SECS event weekends)
  - B. Performance Requirement: A competitor must finish in the top three positions in his class point standings, except SM and SRF where the top five will be invited. Drivers who qualify via Majors path will be skipped in points to determine those who are eligible via SECS.
  - C. A competitor must qualify in the same class in which he is entering the Runoffs, though he may compete in any car eligible for the class.
